- ❑ Creation of an institutional coordination and monitoring-evaluation mechanism



- ❑ Develop and adopt a national strategy defining priority areas of action

- ❑ Raising awareness among cocoa-producing communities to gain their appropriation of the fight against child labor

- ❑ Eliminating causes of families' vulnerability, by improving their socio-economic conditions

❑ Improve children's access to free and quality basic education



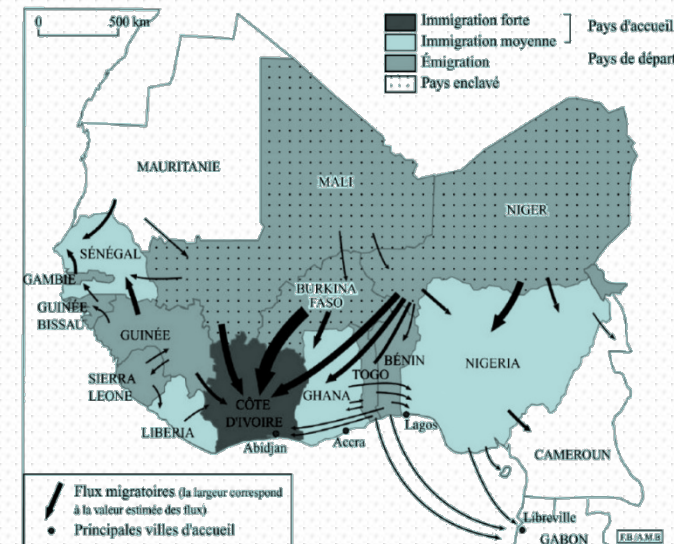
+ 16 000 classrooms for kindergarten and primary schools

❑ Fighting cross-border child trafficking through cooperation agreements with neighbouring countries
