Living incomes and living wages are both about the income level that would enable a family to afford a decent standard of living.

A basic, decent standard of living!



What does it mean to be able to afford a decent standard of living?

The net annual income of a household, which comes from a variety of sources, is sufficient to cover the cost of a decent standard of living for a typical household in a particular place.

What does decency mean in this context?





Toilets: Unacceptable quality and acceptable



Kitchen: Adequate air circulation

How is living income different than poverty alleviation?

The concept goes a step beyond traditional notions of poverty alleviation that are concerned with basic subsistence and survival.

It puts a strong emphasis on the idea of **decency and earning enough income to live comfortably**.

Living Income is becoming a critical topic and discussions on this are fast gaining momentum and being prioritised.

Living wage is an individual concept.

A worker earns enough in a standard work week to enable his/her family to afford a decent standard of living.

Farming households earn enough in a year from all income sources to afford a decent standard of living.

Determining a LIVING INCOME involves calculating the cost of a basic and decent standard of living for a typical household.

3 Key points

- Based on international standards and local validation of the decent standard of living
- Based on the households (large families need more resources than small ones)
- ✓ Is specific to a **particular location**

Credibility of the Living Income Benchmark

A **credible study** for the calculation of the Living Income benchmark...

- is elaborated in consultation with the main actors of the sector
- is based on **national data** on expenses, food costs etc.
- is conducted by an interdisciplinary team of **qualified researchers**
- is supported by a **diversified technical team** for quality control

The Living Income Community of Practice



Based on an average household size of 2 adults and 4 children

- FOOD CFA 124,625 (US\$ 216)
- OTHER ESSENTIAL NEEDS CFA 95,102 (US\$ 165)
- HOUSING CFA 29,850 (US\$ 52)
- UNEXPECTED EVENTS CFA 12,479 (US\$ 22)

Applications of the Living Income Benchmark



- Understanding the income gap for a household or groups of households
- Setting targets for household income growth and model how to reduce the income gap at the household level
- Informing on the targets for indicators related to agricultural production and crops and analyzing the related indicators
 - For example: Use it as a reference to determine a fair price for different products



Income Gap Assessments compare farmers actual incomes to the living income benchmark
